South Carolina State Fire is determining the answers to these three questions:

- 1. How does the fire service perceive known risks related to hoarding?
- 2. How does the fire service prioritize risks they observe in a hoarder's home?
- 3. In what ways does the fire service change how they respond to incidents in a hoarder's home?

If your department responds to any call for service inside a hoarding home, please fill out a questionnaire.

What incidents would require the questionnaire?

 All calls for service in Property Use 419 or 429 where moderate or severe hoarding occurs.

Who should fill out the questionnaire?

• While anyone can fill it out, ideally the incident commander should complete the task.

What is the time commitment?

- Participating departments will submit questionnaires from incidents occurring September 1, 2017, to March 1, 2018.
- Each questionnaire will take less than ten minutes to complete, with a less than fiveminute submission time. There is a printable and an online version of the questionnaire available for you.

What are the benefits of participating in this research project?

- You will be periodically updated on the status of the research project.
- Your department will be acknowledged in any publications of the research upon its completion.
- Your department will be prioritized whenever resources become available as a result of this project.
- Your department will be prioritized when new research opportunities become available through State Fire.
